As our community continues to heal from last Monday's deadly shooting on the campus of Michigan State University, ELPS will continue its support of our students and staff as we recognize that healing from this tragedy is a process and may take weeks, months or even longer for some. My heart was filled to see the photos and videos of many of our high school floor hockey participants who spent much of their Saturday making yard signs to display along Burcham Drive and cutout hearts with positive messages to stick on dorm windows as the community welcomes students back to campus (see our Facebook page). I've included some information below about Spartan Sunday, an event organized to welcome students back to a clean, loving and supportive campus today.

In addition to continued availability of our school counselors, social workers and facility dogs to support our students, the City of East Lansing will have counseling services available this week as follows:

- Hannah Community Center (819 Abbot Rd.): Monday, Feb. 20 Thursday, Feb. 23 from 2:00 6:00 p.m.
- East Lansing Public Library (950 Abbot Rd.): Tuesday, Feb. 21 Friday, Feb. 24 from noon 5:30 p.m.

Next Board of Education Meeting – Monday, February 27, 2023

Last Monday's Board of Education meeting went into recess (and eventually adjourned) when we received word just after 8:30 p.m. of an active shooter on the MSU campus. In addition to Board meeting attendees, our boys' lacrosse team and a few individuals remaining from our girls' basketball triple-header were in the high school when the community-wide Shelter-in-Place was ordered. Approximately 100 individuals remained inside ELHS until we were released around 12:30 a.m. We were thankful to have ELPD onsite throughout the night to provide updates and guidance and as a presence outside when everyone was cleared to leave.

Prior to the meeting's recess and adjournment, new Board of Education officers were elected, and the public comment portion of the meeting was held. Board officers for 2023 are Terah Chambers, President; Elizabeth Lyons, Vice President; Tali Faris-Hylen, Secretary and Kath Edsall, Treasurer. The resignation of Trustee Debbie Walton from the Board of Education was announced (see details below regarding that vacancy). We thank Trustee Walton for her service on the Board for the past two+ years and for her advocacy, support and recognition of our ELPS students and staff.

The ELPS Board of Education will hold its next meeting Monday, February 27 at 7:00 p.m. in the Auditorium in East Lansing High School. The meeting will be held in person and will be live streamed.
