# Board of Education Regular Meeting – July 27, 2020

 The Board of Education will hold its regularly scheduled meeting Monday, July 27 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will be held remotely, and I'll include the link in a future update.

#### **Return to School Information**

 Our teams and committees have been exploring multiple models for fall instruction. The data from the family surveys has been extremely helpful in informing our discussions and planning. We sent out a Staff Survey this morning to gain input from our faculty and staff.

### **ELPS Return to School Work Groups**

Our Return to School Work Groups met last Tuesday and discussed a few "hot topics" – a mask requirement for our elementary students, restricting school visitors, learning options for families, and a closed campus at the high school. These questions were asked on our family survey – results will be shared after the survey closes.

#### **Return to School FAQs:**

1. What is the difference between the MI Safe Start Plan and the MI Safe Start Map? And which one aligns with the phases of the Return to School Roadmap?

The MI Safe Start Plan is a way to show how Michigan's economy will reopen. These six phases are those with which the Return to School Roadmap are aligned. Our region is currently in Phase 4.

The MI Safe Start Map shows "risk phases" for coronavirus, which are indications for where regions stand in battling COVID-19.

- 2. Will families have the option of electing full-time online learning for this fall? Yes, a full-time online learning option will be available for any family that elects to not send their child(ren) back to school this fall. The district is working on a plan to provide a device (and hotspot if need) to all students for in-class and athome learning. More details will be coming!
- 3. Will in-person instruction be offered?

Yes, in-person instruction will be offered. Details are still being developed and will be communicated soon.

4. When will staff and families have more information?

These updates will be sent weekly to communication new information as decisions are made.
