Board of Education Regular Meeting – July 27, 2020

Return to School Information

• Our teams and committees continue to explore multiple models for fall instruction including in-person instruction, hybrid models, and online instruction.

ELPS Return to School Work Groups

- Last week, our work groups reviewed the Family Survey data that was collected from over 1800 respondents. A summary of the survey data is attached to this email. <u>ELPS</u> <u>Family Survey Summary.7.19.20.docx</u>
- Our work group participants also discussed and provided feedback on district priorities for plan development. We asked subgroups to rank the following priorities:
 - Family choice
- Health and safety
- Simplicity of the structure
- Teacher/staff choice (whether or not to return in-person or teach online)
- Supporting economic necessity for parents who need to return to work

 Different plans and models rise to the top depending on how these important priorities are ranked.

Return to School FAQs:

1. What is the status of our region?

Our region remains in Phase 4 of the MI Safe Start Plan and remains in the High Risk category of the MI Safe Start Map.

2. What options for fall instruction are currently being considered?

Our teams continue to explore MANY models and structures for fall learning – in-person, hybrid and online learning. We are trying hard to meet the needs of our students, our families, our faculty and staff, and our community. It's becoming increasingly evident that we will not be able to check every box we'd like to check as this challenge is so complex, and every plan has its pros and cons. As new information and data is released, we evaluate and respond and sometimes change our course. No decisions have been made, but they will be made and communicated soon (see next question).

3. When will staff and families have more information?

Here is our timeline for development and communication of our ELPS COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Plan:

- Week of July 6 district-level planning
- Weeks of July 13 and 20 building-level planning with committees
- July 27 Draft Preparedness Plan available and presented at Board of Education meeting
- Week of July 27 receive feedback on Preparedness Plan and make adjustments
- August 10 Board of Education to take action on Preparedness Plan
